Volunteer Assignment

Peace Through Action Meet-Ups are small group gatherings where participants have a structured conversation that leads up to participants generating personal action plans for peace. The action plan identifies steps the participant can take in their own community or nationally.

The Peace Through Action meet-ups activity leader organizes and runs the gathering. The leader decides who they want to invite to their meet-up and where and when it will take place.

Using a resource prepared by Peace Through Action®, the leader guides participants through a structured step-by-step conversation. Participants accumulate insights about themselves. They enter that information into ChatGPT. (ChatGPT is an artificial intelligence chatbot.) The query result generates is the participant's personal action plan for peace.

The meet-ups activity leader encourages participants to complete a brief post-session survey. They complete a brief form to share information about their meet-up with Peace Through Action.
